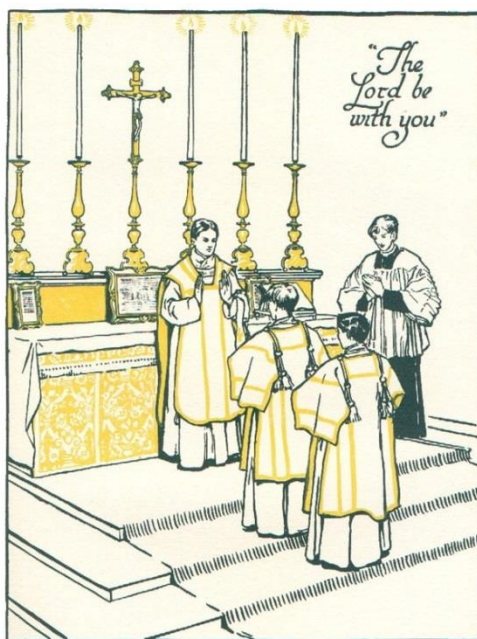

We SIT for the First reading – Wisdom 7:7-11

I prayed, and understanding was given me;
I entreated, and the spirit of Wisdom came to me.
I esteemed her more than sceptres and thrones;
compared with her, I held riches as nothing.
I reckoned no priceless stone to be her peer,
for compared with her, all gold is a pinch of sand,
and beside her silver ranks as mud.
I loved her more than health or beauty,
preferred her to the light,
since her radiance never sleeps.
In her company all good things came to me,
at her hands riches not to be numbered.

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

Responsorial Psalm – Psalm 89 (90):12-17

R: Fill us with your love so that we may rejoice.

Make us know the shortness of our life
that we may gain wisdom of heart.
Lord, relent! Is your anger for ever?
Show pity to your servants. **R**
In the morning, fill us with your love;
we shall exult and rejoice all our days.

Second Reading – Hebrews 4:12-13

The word of God is something alive and active: it cuts like any double-edged sword but more finely: it can slip through the place where the soul is divided from the spirit, or joints from the marrow; it can judge the secret emotions and thoughts. No created thing can hide from him; everything is uncovered and open to the eyes of the one to whom we must give account of ourselves.

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

People: Thanks be to God.

The Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, **Alleluia.**

Blessed are you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth,
for revealing the mysteries of the kingdom to mere children.

Alleluia.

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark. +

Glory to you, O Lord.



The Gospel – Mark 10:17-30

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, ‘Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?’ Jesus said to him, ‘Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.’ And he said to him, ‘Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.’ Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, ‘There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.’ But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth.

Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, ‘How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!’ The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, ‘My children,’ he said to them ‘how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.’ They were more astonished than ever. ‘In that case’ they said to one another ‘who can be saved?’ Jesus gazed at them. ‘For men’ he said ‘it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.’

Peter took this up. ‘What about us?’ he asked him. ‘We have left everything and followed you.’ Jesus said, ‘I tell you solemnly, there is no one who has left house, brothers, sisters, father, children or land for my sake and for the

sake of the gospel who will not be repaid a hundred times over, houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and land – not without persecutions – now in this present time and, in the world to come, eternal life.’

Priest: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

People: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

The Homily – PLEASE SIT.

After the homily there is a time of silence. At the end, PLEASE STAND with the priest for the Nicene Creed:

I believe in one God,

the Father, Almighty, maker of heaven and earth,

And of all things, visible and invisible.

And in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of his Father, before all worlds:

God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God,

begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father;

by whom all things were made.

Who for us men and for our salvation came down from Heaven:

(all bow) **and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary,**

and was made man.

And was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate.

He suffered and was buried:

and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures;

and ascended into Heaven,

and sitteth at the right hand of the Father.

And he shall come again with glory

to judge both the quick and the dead,

whose kingdom shall have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, and giver of life,

who proceedeth from the Father and the Son;

who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped

and glorified, who spake by the prophets.

And I believe in one Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church.

I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins.

And I look for the resurrection of the dead

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Prayers of the Faithful - after each set of prayers we say:

Lord, hear us. **Lord graciously hear us**

We pray for those who have died...

Rest eternal grant unto them O Lord.

And let light perpetual shine upon them.

May they rest in peace. **Amen.**

With the prayers of Mary, Mother of God, Our Lady of Walsingham:

Hail, Mary, **full of grace, the Lord is with thee.**

Blessed art thou among women,

and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus.

**Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now,
and at the hour of our death.**

The Priest concludes the prayers:

Merciful Father, **accept these prayers for the sake of your Son,
our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.**

The Offertory

PLEASE STAND to sing the Offertory hymn, NEH 440, during which the Gifts are prepared and a collection is taken.

PRAISE to the Lord, the Almighty, the King of creation;

O my soul, praise him, for he is thy health and salvation

Come ye who hear,

Brothers and sisters draw near,

Praise him in glad adoration.

2. Praise to the Lord, who o'er all things so wondrously reigneth,
Shelters thee under his wings, yea, so gently sustained:

Hast thou not seen

All that is needful hath been

Granted in what he ordaineth?

3. Praise to the Lord, who doth prosper thy work, and defend thee;
Surely his goodness and mercy here daily attend thee;

Ponder anew

All the Almighty can do,

He who with love doth befriend thee

4. Praise to the Lord, who, when tempests their warfare are waging,
Who, when the elements madly around thee are raging,

Biddeth them cease,

Turneth their fury to peace,

+ THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST +

PLEASE STAND to be censed.

Pray, my brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Father Almighty.

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his Holy Church.

*The priest says the **Prayer over the Gifts**, to which all respond **Amen**.*

The Eucharistic Prayers:

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts. **We lift them up to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give him thanks and praise.**

*The priest sings the **Preface**, thanking God for His mighty works in creation and redemption. The choir sings the **Sanctus** and **Benedictus** (Holy, Holy, Holy...)*

The Mystery of Faith:

Christ has died - Christ is risen - Christ will come again

*At the end of the **Eucharistic Prayer** we all join in with **Amen**.*

The Lord's Prayer:

At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we are bold to say:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name;

thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

**Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses,
 as we forgive those who trespass against us;**

and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Deliver us, Lord ... and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever. Amen.

The Peace:

The priest prays for the unity of the Church.

The peace of the Lord be with you always. **And also with you.**

Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away the sins of the world.

Blessed are those who are called to the supper of the Lamb.

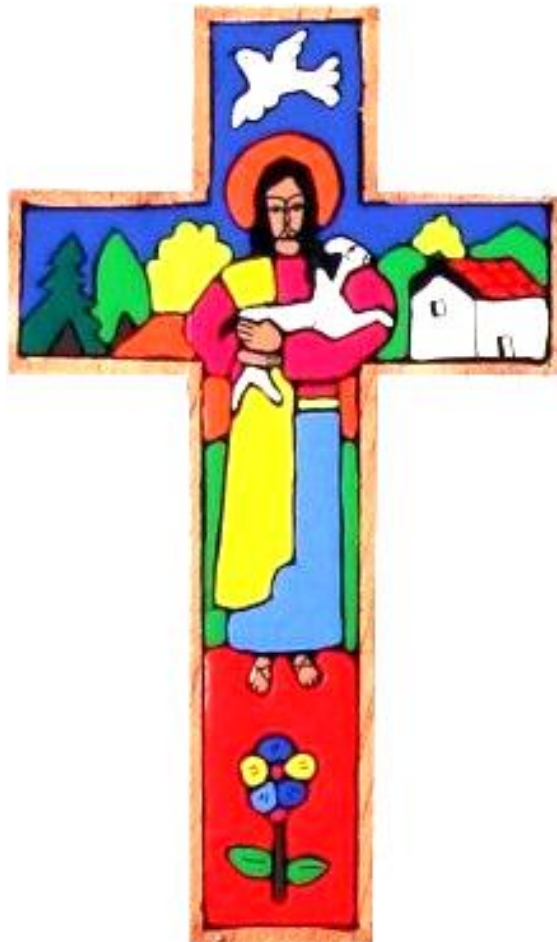
**Lord, I am not worthy to receive you,
but only say the word and I shall be healed.**

Holy Communion:

All those baptised with water in the name of the Trinity, and who are communicant members of their own church, are very welcome to receive Holy Communion here.

*Otherwise, please come to the altar for a blessing, if you so wish (keeping your head bowed until blessed). During the distribution of Holy Communion, the choir sings the **Agnus Dei** (O Lamb of God...) from the Mass setting and the*

Communion Antiphon, followed by a period of silence – **PLEASE KNEEL or SIT.**



*At the end PLEASE STAND with the priest for the **Prayer after Communion**, to which all respond **Amen.***

PLEASE SIT while the notices are given.

+ THE CONCLUDING RITES +

The Lord be with you. **And also with you**

*The priest says the **Solemn Blessing.***

*After each section: **Amen.***

Go forth the mass has ended. **Thanks be to God.**

The clergy, servers and people face the principal image of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and sing the words of the Archangel Gabriel to Mary:

Angelus:

The Angel of the Lord brought tidings to Mary;

And she conceived by the Holy Ghost.

Hail, Mary, full of grace,
the Lord is with thee:
blessed art thou among women,
and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus.

**Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners,
now and at the hour of our death. Amen.**

Behold the handmaid of the Lord.

Be it unto me according to thy Word. Hail, Mary...

And the Word was made flesh; **And dwelt among us. Hail, Mary...**

Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God:

That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

We beseech Thee, O Lord,
pour Thy grace into our hearts;
that as we have known the Incarnation of Thy Son,
Jesus Christ,
by the message of an angel,
so by His Cross and Passion
we may be brought unto the glory of His Resurrection.
Through the same Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**



As the Altar Party departs, we sing the final hymn NEH 413:

NOW thank we all our God,
With heart and hands and voices,
Who wondrous things hath done,
In whom his world rejoices;
Who from our mother's arms
Hath blessed us on our way
With countless gifts of love,
And still is ours today.

2. O may this bounteous God
Through all our life be near us,
With ever-joyful hearts
And blessed peace to cheer us;
And keep us in his grace,
And guide us when perplexed,
And free us from all ills
In this world and the next.

3. All praise and thanks to God
The Father now be given,
The Son, and Him who reigns

The One eternal God,
