The choir sings the **Kyrie** while the Altar is reverenced by the clergy and censed.

The choir sing the **Gloria**. Please feel free to sit.

Glory be to God on high,

And in earth peace, goodwill towards men.

We praise thee, we bless thee, we worship thee, we glorify thee.

We give thanks to thee for thy great glory.

O Lord God, heavenly King, God the Father Almighty.

O Lord, the only begotten Son, Jesu Christ.

O Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father.

That takest away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us.

Thou that takest away the sins of the world, receive our prayer.

Thou that sittest at the right hand of God the Father, have mercy upon us.

The Collect:

We STAND, as the priest invites us to pray and after a brief pause he says:

Almighty ever-living God, constantly accomplish the Paschal Mystery within us, that those you were pleased to make new in Holy Baptism may, under your protective care, bear much fruit and come to the joys of life eternal.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

+ THE LITURGY OF THE WORD +

We SIT for the First reading – Acts 14:21-27

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles:

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.

Reader: The Word of the Lord. **People: Thanks be to God.**

The choir sings the **Responsorial Psalm**: 144(145):8-13a

Response: Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

The Lord is kind and full of compassion, slow to anger, abounding in love.

How good is the Lord to all, compassionate to all his creatures. **R**

All your creatures shall thank you, O Lord, and your friends shall repeat their blessing. They shall speak of the glory of your reign and declare your might, O God, to make known to men your mighty deeds and the glorious splendour of your reign. **R**

Yours is an everlasting kingdom; your rule lasts from age to age. **R**

Second Reading – Apocalypse 21:1-5

A reading from the Revelation to St John the Divine:

I, John, saw a new heaven and a new earth; the first heaven and the first earth had disappeared now, and there was no longer any sea. I saw the holy city, and the new Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven, as beautiful as a bride all dressed for her husband. Then I heard a loud voice call from the throne, 'You see this city? Here God lives among men. He will make his home among them; they shall be his people, and he will be their God; his name is God-with-them. He will wipe away all tears from their eyes; there will be no more death, and no more mourning or sadness. The world of the past has gone.'

Then the One sitting on the throne spoke: 'Now I am making the whole of creation new.'

Reader: The Word of the Lord. **People: Thanks be to God.**

The Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia. Alleluia.

'My little children, I shall not be with you much longer.



The Homily – PLEASE SIT.



After the homily there is a time of silence. At the end, PLEASE STAND with the priest for the **Nicene Creed**:

I believe in one God,

the Father, Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, And of all things, visible and invisible.

And in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of his Father, before all worlds:

God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father; by whom all things were made.

Who for us men and for our salvation came down from Heaven:

(All bow) and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

And was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate.

He suffered and was buried:

and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures; and ascended into Heaven,

and sitteth at the right hand of the Father.

And he shall come again with glory to judge both the quick and the dead, whose kingdom shall have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, and giver of life, who proceedeth from the Father and the Son; who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified, who spake by the prophets.

And I believe in one Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church. I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins. And I look for the resurrection of the dead

and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Prayers of the Faithful - after each set of prayers we say:

Rest eternal grant unto them O Lord.

And let light perpetual shine upon them.

May they rest in peace. Amen.

With the prayers of Mary, Mother of God, Our Lady of Walsingham:

Hail, Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee.


Blessed art thou among women,

The Priest concludes the prayers:

The Offertory

PLEASE STAND to sing the Offertory hymn, **NEH 351**, during which the Gifts are prepared and a collection is taken.

COME, ye faithful, raise the anthem, Cleave the skies with shouts of praise; Sing to him who found the ransom, Ancient of eternal days, God eternal, word incarnate, Whom the heaven of heaven obeys.

- 2. Ere he raised the lofty mountains, Formed the sea, or built the sky, Love eternal, free and boundless, Forced the Lord of life to die, Lifted up the Prince of princes On the throne of Calvary.

+ THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST +

PLEASE STAND to be censed.

Pray, my brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Father Almighty.

May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good, and the good of all his Holy Church.

The priest says the Prayer over the Gifts, to which all respond Amen.

The Eucharistic Prayers:

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Lift up your hearts. We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The priest sings the **Preface**, thanking God for His mighty works in creation and redemption. The choir sings the **Sanctus** and **Benedictus** (Holy, Holy, Holy...)

The Mystery of Faith:

Christ has died - Christ is risen - Christ will come again

At the end of the Eucharistic Prayer we all join in with Amen.

The Lord's Prayer:

At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we are bold to say:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Deliver us, Lord ... and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever. Amen.

The Peace:

The priest prays for the unity of the Church.

The peace of the Lord be with you always. And also with you.

Behold the Lamb of God. Behold him who takes away the sins of the world.

Blessed are those who are called to the supper of the Lamb.

Lord, I am not worthy to receive you, but only say the word and I shall be healed.

Holy Communion:

All those baptised with water in the name of the Trinity, and who are communicant members of their own church, are very welcome to receive Holy Communion here. Otherwise, please come to the altar for a blessing, if you so wish (keeping your head bowed until blessed). During the distribution of Holy Communion, the choir sings

the **Agnus Dei** (O Lamb of God...) from the Mass setting and the **Communion Antiphon**, followed by a period of silence – PLEASE KNEEL or SIT.

At the end PLEASE STAND with the priest for the **Prayer after Communion**, to which all respond **Amen**.

PLEASE SIT while the notices are given.

+ THE CONCLUDING RITE +

Priest: The Lord be with you. **People:** And also with you.

Priest: May Almighty God bless you,

• the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

Cantor: Ite, missa est, Alleluia! Alleluia! People: Deo gratias, Alleluia, Alleluia!

The clergy, servers and people face the principal image of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and rejoice with Mary in Christ's Resurrection singing

Regina Cœli:

Joy to thee, O Queen of Heaven, Alleluia! He whom thou was meet to bear, Alleluia! As he promised has arisen, Alleluia! Pour for us to God thy prayer, Alleluia!

Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, Alleluia!

For the Lord is risen indeed, Alleluia!

A Collect follows to which we respond: Amen.

As the Altar Party departs, we sing the final hymn: NEH 112

JESUS lives! thy terrors now Can, O Death, no more appal us; Jesus lives! by this we know Thou, O grave, canst not enthral us. 3. Jesus lives! for us he died; Then, alone to Jesus living, Pure in heart may we abide. Glory to our Saviour giving.


