After thy great goodness.

Thou shalt purge me, O Lord...

The absolution by the Priest follows:

May almighty God cleanse us of our sins,
and through the celebration of this Eucharist
make us worthy to share at the table of his Kingdom.

Amen.

THE GLORIA IN EXCELSIS

¶ *Sit after the opening phrase.*

*Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth.
Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father,
we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.*

*Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us;
you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.*

*For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord,
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,
in the glory of God the Father. Amen.*

THE CREED

I believe in one God,
the Father, Almighty, maker of heaven and earth,
And of all things, visible and invisible.

And in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God,
begotten of his Father, before all worlds:
God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God,
begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father;
by whom all things were made.

Who for us men and for our salvation came down from Heaven:

(we bow our heads for the next two lines:)

**and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary,
and was made man.**

And was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate.

He suffered and was buried:

**and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures;
and ascended into Heaven,
and sitteth at the right hand of the Father.**

**And he shall come again with glory
to judge both the quick and the dead,
whose kingdom shall have no end.**

**And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, and giver of life,
who proceedeth from the Father and the Son;
who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped
and glorified, who spake by the prophets.**

And I believe in one Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church.

I acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins.

**And I look for the resurrection of the dead
and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

now and at the hour of our death.**

All respond to the concluding prayer:

Amen.



THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

A collection is taken during the hymn.

HYMN - NEH 271

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

The Priest praises God for his mighty acts and the Sanctus & Benedictus are then sung:

*Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.*

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

¶ *Kneel.*

The Priest continues the prayer and after the words of consecration:

The mystery of faith:

We proclaim your Death, O Lord,

and profess your Resurrection until you come again.

At the conclusion of the prayer, all respond:

Amen.

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world.

Anyone who is baptized and a communicant member of any church is welcome to receive Communion.

If you don't receive Communion you're invited to come up for a blessing—please indicate this by carrying this booklet.

At the distribution of the Sacrament:

The Body of Christ.

During Communion the Agnus Dei from today's Mass setting and the Communion Antiphon are sung.
